1. Activities carried out by CUTS in the month of July, 2014

1.1 The first CUTS SDIP Annual Organisational Report was prepared in the month of July in compliance with the clauses mentioned in the MoU and Grant Agreement between CUTS and DFAT. 1.2 The modalities of agreements between CUTS and its nine strategic partners were in process in the month of July. CUTS advised and approved the activity plans of our nine strategic partners. The strategic partners were given full flexibility in designing their own activities under SDIP project. The respective activity plan served as a Terms of Reference in the MoU signed with the parties in contract. A synopsis of the partners' activities is listed in the CUTS SDIP Work Plan for the first phase.

1.3 During the same month SDIP team was in field conducting diagnostic study interviews with the stakeholders in the five project countries (Bhutan, Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Pakistan).

1.4 As part of the SDIP monitoring system, CUTS had a first round of discussion with IOD PARC on 29th July 2014. CUTS SDIP team shared the 'change pathway' relevant to its work under SDIP with IOD PARC with respect to the domains of change- civil society voice for change, reform and standards for basin wide water management; and collaborative structures between farmer organisations and service providers, agro-business, researchers and relevant public agencies in the Brahmaputra basin.

2. Activities carried out by CUTS in the month of August, 2014

The goal of this dialogue was to have an informed and reflective discussion between SDIP partners on where and how change is taking place in the development space where the investment portfolio is engaged.
