Pre UNCTAD XII Civil Society Forum

On the occasion of the quadrennial meeting of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD XII) in Accra, Ghana on 20-25 April 2008, CUTS CITEE organised a two-day international conference each in Nairobi, Kenya, on March 13-14, 2008 and in Hanoi, Vietnam, during March 06-07, 2008, within the framework of its project on Linkages between Trade, Development and Poverty Reduction (TDP).

These meetings formulated a set of key messages to feed them into the Civil Society Forum of UNCTAD XII. In both the places, the stakeholders discussed the four sub-themes of the UNCTAD XII. Participants included civil society organisations (CSOs), business associations, media, academics, government officials, representatives from international and inter-governmental organisations and the donor community from around the Asian region, with special priority given to developing and least developed economies. Training on "IPR and Related WTO Issues"

CUTS CITEE organised this training programme at Jaipur during April 28-May 02, 2008. It was designed for the scientists and technologists and aimed towards facilitating them on the basic principles of multilateral trading system (MTS) enshrined in the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and inculcate an understanding of the trade rules that apply to intellectual property rights (IPRs) under the Trade Related Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPs) Agreement. It sought to prepare the scientists and technologists to better exploit the opportunities that arise from the use of IPRs and help them in understanding advance IPR and WTO related issues and drafting of patents.
