


Webinars

Understanding Logistics Ecosystem in Bihar and its Scope for Improvement

Two major initiatives taken by the Government of India to improve the logistics ecosystem in India are the National Logistic Policy launched in September 2022 and PM Gati Shakti Master Plan launched in October 2021. These two initiatives are expected to reshape India's logistics landscape and lower logistics costs from its current 14 per cent GDP to less than 10 per cent in the coming years. States in India, including Bihar, have a crucial role in this.

This Briefing Paper examines Bihar's connectivity and logistics scenario regarding the availability of transport infrastructure and ease of movement of freight and people.

Role of Northeast Indian States in Shaping India's Logistics Performance

Recognising the salience of logistics, the Union Government has notified the National Logistics Policy, 2022. It is implementing the PM Gati Shakti Master Plan to bring efficiency in logistic services and human resources and integrate infrastructure and network planning. India's States and Union Territories have a pivotal role in logistical planning and development.

This Briefing Paper tries to chart the logistical and connectivity situation in the Northeastern States of India. It

attempts to identify the potential of the Northeastern States in terms of trade (both domestic and international), bottlenecks towards improving the state's logistic landscapes, initiatives to improve the logistic ecosystem, and discusses the scope and opportunities to improve its logistic performances.

Scope and Potential for Multimodal ICPs in the Northeast Region of India

One major development that has significantly contributed to increased trade among the BBIN countries is the establishment of Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) at several border check posts, replacing the Land Customs Stations (LCS).

This Briefing Paper attempts to explore the possibility of connecting operational ICPs in the Northeast Region (NER) of India with multimodal transportation –railways, waterways, and airways. It identifies two ICPs at Sutarkandi in Assam and Sabroom in Tripura, which has the potential to be connected with other modes of transportation in addition to roadways.



Further, the paper also argues for making Dhubri river port in Assam a multimodal ICP based on its strategic location and its proximity to different modes of transportation.

Strengthening Inter-State Connectivity in India's Bordering States for Trade and Inclusive Development



India's bordering states comprise states which share international land borders with countries in Eastern South and Southeast Asia, namely Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan and Myanmar. Despite their strategic importance, the economic progress of these states has remained sub-optimal both in terms of basic infrastructure and logistical performance, and their logistics remain in poor condition.

This may change now given two significant initiatives by the Government of India to improve India's logistics ecosystem- the National Logistics Policy launched in September 2022 and PM Gati Shakti Master Plan launched in October 2021.

This Briefing Paper attempts to understand transport connectivity and logistics preparedness of India's bordering states to fully contribute towards making India a global manufacturing and logistics hub. It also suggests measures to improve the logistics and trade ecosystem.

Establishing a Consensus on Development: On G20-Led WTO Reforms

The preamble to the agreement establishing the WTO recognises the need for developing countries to ensure they can "secure a share in international trade commensurate with the needs of their economic development." The WTO's built-in agenda was designed against this backdrop; however, its partial and unsatisfactory fulfilment has led to increasing frustration among developing countries.



There is a crucial need to undertake a comprehensive review of the systemic issues plaguing the WTO's rulemaking, implementation, and dispute-settlement functions to identify the issues that are stilting prospects of trade and development in developing countries.

This will offer evidence-based and pragmatic compromises to reinvigorate and possibly institutionalise a development-oriented approach to the WTO's functioning. India's G20 presidency offers an opportunity to drive reformatory interventions for a development-friendly WTO and enable further tangible benefits from the special and differential treatment provisions to which developing countries are entitled.
